**CREDIT POINT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION**

A total of 144 Credit Points are required with

- A Maximum of 10 units (60 points) from First Year Level,
- At Least 6 units (36 Points) from Second Year Level And
- At Least 6 units (36 Points) from Third Year Level
- A Major of 8 units (48 points) with a minimum of Two Units of Second-Year Level and Two Units of Third-Year Level
